Letter of Collaboration and Support with Y on Earth Community, Colorado, 2025 & beyond, Zazu Dreams: Between the Scarab and the Dung Beetle,

A Cautionary Fable for the Anthropocene Era cross-cultural, intergenerational, climate justice book, stage, and screen adaptation

Zazu Dreams' (book and film—both used in intergenerational performances) focus on educating and supporting families in low-income and underserved communities. We highlight not only relevant, but urgent concerns for these communities—including environmental racism and corporate accountability. Additionally, our programming includes collective possibilities for

- 1. "Edible Education:" food equity through community-based performances,
- 2. S.O.U.L. (Shared Opportunity Used Local): mutual aid economies through our local free store,
- 3. The Love Bus: creative affordable housing through my family's eco-art converted school bus tiny home which we have lived in for seven years and performed dozens of times.

I have performed my stage adaptation of *Zazu Dreams* over fifty times in community centers, cultural venues, multicultural synagogues, temples, universities, planetariums, science centers, ecological-focused conferences (ranging from climate refugees, textile tyrannies, ocean plastic pollution to food-waste solutions, water justice, get-off-the-grid festivals). Through the vast diversity of Indigenous Diasporas, I explore cross-cultural principles that reflect an imperative for a pluralistic equitable ecojustice. By entering the audience's consciousness through the vehicle of storytelling, the documentary animation evokes a reconsideration of the ecological and social justice consequences of one's daily choices. Visual storytelling that connects our extraordinarily diverse cultural pasts and present helps build a strong sense of interconnectedness. Through a visual representation of simultaneous multiple events, perspectives, and languages, this kind of connective storytelling leads to individual and group empowerment. One of the book's endorsers, Arun Gandhi (Mahatma Gandhi's grandson) wrote: "*Zazu Dreams* is a fascinating story that launches a new genre of book called edutainment. Amazing research!"



Dear Aaron,

It is with great pleasure to present this letter of collaboration to the Y on Earth Community to support the EPA's "Thriving Communities Grantmaking Program". Over the past few years, I have witnessed the growth and invaluable outreach of YoE programs as a global network of planetary stewardship, and I'm delighted to add my voice in support of your mission.

After completing my Permaculture Design Certificate (PDC) in 2019, I've focused on translating my skill sets in landscape architecture towards strategies in regenerative agriculture and permaculture. This repositioning stemmed from two fundamental concerns. First, the planetary degradation from industrial farming and subsequent unhealthy food system, and second, a theoretical underpinning regarding what I believe is a basic tenant of landscape architecture; to act as an agent of restoration and regeneration. This has been demonstrated recently through work completed along the Front Range and Roaring Fork Valley. Current projects include transforming a historic cattle ranch in collaboration with Eco Systems Design into regenerative agriculture, silvopasture, and the design of a perennial food forest. Perhaps most dear to my heart is consulting with the Southern Ute Tribe on a food sovereignty program, focused on traditional native crop varieties, and medicinal and ceremonial plants. In addition, I co-manage an organic farm near Lyons, CO, for which we have recently received grant money for our soil health initiatives.

Although I have left my position as Executive Director of the Central Rocky Mountain Permaculture Institute (CRMPI.org), I remain connected to CRMPI through teaching and consulting, supporting their permaculture practicum. This program allows students to work directly with clients on permaculture design projects. One such project currently in development is designing a wellness center based on permaculture principles.

As I connect the dots from 20+ years in academia, landscape architecture, and permaculture, I'm working on a series of essays towards publication that document the intersection of these disciplines. As I develop these essays, I would be more than happy to share my work on YoE podcasts, as well as advising and consulting on key projects, including lectures and webinars for YoE course offerings.

The Valley Roots Food Hub is pleased to offer our support to the Y on Earth Community in their work to address food insecurity, neighborhood resilience, regenerative agriculture, and local food supply chains.

Our food hub has over 160 producers of produce, meat, dairy, and value-added products. For 51 weeks per year, we serve 20-30 wholesale and institutional customers, and 30-50 residential customers across the State from Durango to Denver/Springs/Pueblo, and Antonito to Frisco. We also operate our own software platform that connects local producers with customers, while giving a food hub the tools it needs to logistically accomplish the job.

Our founding platform was to support, promote, and purchase local food from producers that were growing living soil, and growing food in living soils thereby increasing the viability of regenerative agriculture. We also are working towards a transition of a carbon-laden supply chain by investing in electric trucks and infrastructure (where the source energy could be carbon-neutral), conducting feasibilities of solar- hydrogen fueled trucks, and we are currently commissioning an EPA-funded anerobic digester that will be serving our campus in Mosca, CO by taking organic byproducts and food wastes and producing methane-rich biogas. This fuel will be used for cooking, heating, and processing and someday perhaps will fuel food delivery trucks as well.


